WHO CAN APPLY?


Teachers, counselors, media specialists, nurses, and social workers can apply for a Foundation Grant.

HOW MUCH CAN I REQUEST?

The maximum amount of funds you can request is \$2,000.

WHAT PRIORITIES SHOULD I KEEP IN MIND?

Grant requests should incorporate one or more of the following PHSD priorities:









While we understand the importance of classroom materials like books and STEM supplies, we will only consider funding the purchase of these supplies if they are a necessary component of a larger project.

APPLICATION PROCESS





CONCEPT APPROVAL

The first step in the grant application process is concept approval to ensure your grant idea is compatible with the District's and Foundation's priorities. **This increases the likelihood that your grant will be funded**. If your idea does not align with the priorities, we'll let you know (nicely), so you don't spend valuable time completing an application.

Be prepared to answer these questions:

- •Why this grant? What inspired it?
- What is the type of initiative?
 School-wide
 Multiple Grades/Departments
 Grade Level or Department
 Classroom/Club
- •What topic/subject will your students learn about?
- •Which PHSD priorities will your grant best align with?

- •What is your learning goal?
- •Estimated number of students who will directly benefit from the grant?
- •What student population will your project benefit?
- •How much will you be requesting?
- •How will you know if your grant has been successful?

The Concept Review Committee includes District leadership, including Technology, and Foundation representatives to ensure possible grants align with priorities and consider the potential impact on our students.



APPLICATION & BUDGET

If your grant proposal gets approved, it will be time to complete the Shining Star Application. The application asks for this information.

- Amount of request
- What is the type of initiative?
 School-wide
 Multiple Grades/Departments
 Grade Level or Department
 Classroom/Club



- Student population that will benefit from the grant
- •Estimated number of students who will directly benefit from the grant
- Topic/subject your students will be learning about
- Priorities grant best aligns with
- •Grant summary and a detailed description
- Grant evaluation plan
- Plan for assessing student learning/growth

APPLICATION TIPS:

- Don't use jargon. Explain educational concepts clearly.
- •If you use an acronym, be sure to spell it out the first time it is used.
- Focus on how your grant will enrich student learning.
- Make the connection crystal clear between your grant and PHSD priorities.



IMPORTANT!

You must have approval in order to complete these steps.



BUDGET TIPS:

- Don't handwrite your budget.
- Don't pad your budget with unnecessary items.
- Be sure the amount on your application form matches what you submit on the Budget Form.
- You will need to list all the items you plan to purchase, from where, and if they are necessary to make the grant successful.

GRANT REVIEW

The Foundation Grant Committee will review applications to ensure alignment with priorities and for the potential impact on our students. If there are any concerns the Foundation Grant Committee will consult District leadership.



APPLICATION FUNDING

If your grant application is accepted, you will receive a surprise visit from our Surprise Squad with the happy news!

Funds will be available within one week once you are notified. To purchase the supplies for your grant you will work with **your building's Administrative Assistant**. If you haven't spent all of the grant funds by December 1st we will make arrangements for the return of the funds.

SHARE YOUR STORY

We want to hear about the **impact you are making on our students!** You get recognized for all of your dedication to our students and we get the credit for funding your grant!

- Complete a brief final report as soon as your grant is complete. We will provide a form.
- We require photos & videos of your students engaged with the funded grant to share with supporters.
- We will occasionally reach out to you to get a progress update and we might schedule a visit to see the grant in action.
- We will share your grant story on social media and in our newsletters. And we encourage you to do the same.
